## A FEW TIPS FOR SHOWING PRODUCE

- \* Stalks, calyx should be left on the fruit.
- \* Do not rub off the bloom on plums & polish apples
- \* Runner beans should have a stalk.
- \* Pink Fir Apple Potatoes are red so enter in the coloured class.

## COMPETITION RULES FOR ALL SECTIONS AND CLASSES

1. Adults: Entry Fee 40p per entry.  
Juniors: Free entry in all Junior Classes.  
School Year Group 7-9 have free entry to Adult Classes
2. Only one entry in any one class except where stated.
3. Exhibits to be staged between 9.30am and 11.00am.

6. All produce must be made or grown by the exhibitor with the exception of Section H – Flower Arranging.

### RULES

The wine must be at least 2 years old.  
Wine must be exhibited in standard bottle with shoulders, claret style with punt. Bottle to be clean and bright. White plastic topped cork. NO label or marking.  
To be presented with wine to level  $\frac{1}{2}$ " –  $\frac{3}{4}$ " (1.25cm – 1.875cm) below the cork.  
Bitter Beer must be exhibited in clear bottles with appropriate stoppers. Each exhibit must conform to specifications in its class and will be judged on clarity.

<p><b><u>Victoria Sandwich Cake</u></b></p> <p>150g SR Flour 150g Margarine 150g Caster Sugar 3 Eggs Jam filling</p> <p><b>2 x7"/18cm Cake Tins</b></p> <p>Gas 4 / 180C (Fan oven 160C) Approx 30 minutes</p>	<p><b><u>Ginger Loaf (Men Only)</u></b></p> <p>100g Butter 100g Soft brown sugar 100g Black treacle 200g Plain flour 2 tsp Ground ginger 2 tsp Cinnamon 1 Egg 1 tsp Bicarbonate of soda 125ml Warm milk</p> <p>Oven 140 C Fan, Gas 2. Line and grease a 2lb loaf tin. Melt butter, sugar and treacle in a saucepan, stirring. Allow to cool slightly, then add beaten egg. In a bowl sift plain flour, spices, add the melted mixture and beat well. Mix the bicarbonate of soda into the warm milk, add to the mixture and stir well. Pour into tin. Cook for 1 hour. Leave in tin to cool. Then turn out onto a rack.</p>
